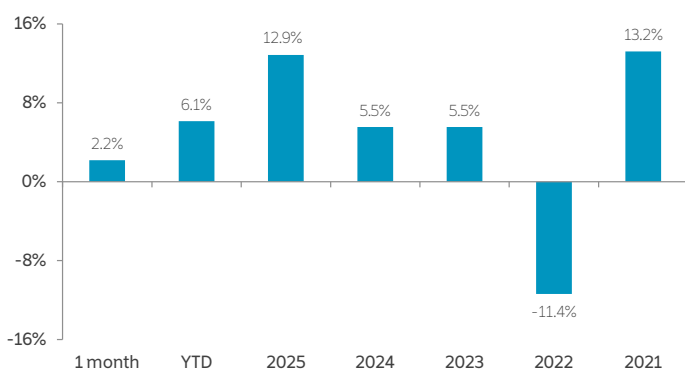

Cumulative returns (since Fund inception, 12.08.2011)**



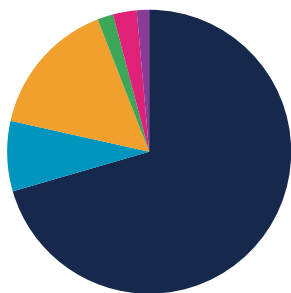

Manager commentary

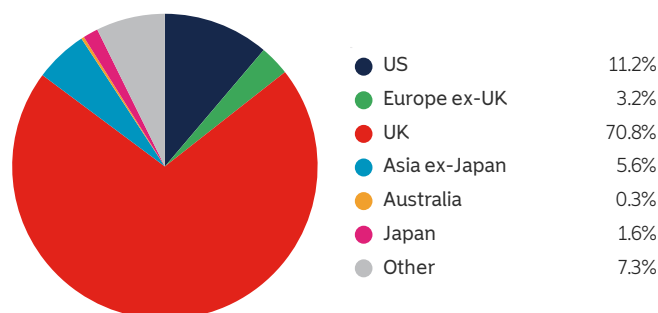
» July was volatile but broadly resilient for risk assets. Global equities edged higher, as generally solid corporate earnings and renewed confidence in the profitability of AI-related investment offset concerns about elevated technology valuations, renewed Middle East hostilities and rising energy costs; European shares recorded a fourth consecutive monthly gain, although Asian technology markets were notably weaker. Government bonds came under pressure as the oil shock revived inflation concerns: the Federal Reserve, European Central Bank, Bank of England and Bank of Japan all left policy rates unchanged, but hawkish votes and guidance increased expectations of further tightening, with the US 10-year Treasury yield briefly reaching 4.75% and the 30-year yield 5.25%. Commodities were dominated by energy, as disruption around the Strait of Hormuz lifted Brent crude by 24% and WTI by 21% over the month, while gold gained around 1% despite falling sharply on the final trading day. In currencies, the dollar gave back earlier gains late in July, the euro strengthened modestly, and the yen fell to a near 40-year low before Japanese - and subsequently coordinated US-Japanese - intervention triggered a sharp rebound.

» Against this backdrop, we left manager selection and asset allocation unchanged in the Portfolios.

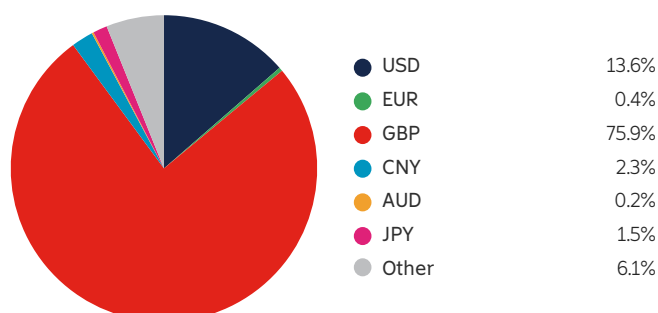
